HEATING HINTS
By James Stewart

WHEN the heating season draws to a close, I'd like to suggest a few precautions to be taken when shutting down your heating plant.

First—be sure to leave a layer of ashes on the grates.

Next—close all the furnace doors and dampers. This will prevent the hot, damp air of the cellar from circulating through the furnace and causing the heating surfaces and smoke pipe to rust.

If your heating plant is of the steam or hot water type, I'd also suggest that you drain off all the water in the boiler. This will get rid of any sediment that may have collected in your boiler during the winter. But be sure to again fill the boiler to the normal level—do not let it stand empty during the summer—if you follow these precautions you'll not only save on repair bills but you will also prolong the life of your furnace.
