heating plant. First-be sure to leave a layer of ashes on the grates. Next - close all the furnace doors and dampers. This will prevent the

causing the heating surfaces and smoke pipe to rust. If your heating plant is of the steam or hot water type, I'd also suggest that you drain off all the water in the boiler. This will get rid of any sediment that may have collected in your boiler during the winter. But be sure to again fill the boiler to the normal level-do not let it stand empty during the nummer. If you follow these precautions you'll not only save on repair bills but you will also pro-
