REV. JONES OF STREETVILLE SPEAKS AT W. A. MEETING

A large and varied collection of pottery and china had been gathered to serve as illustrations to which Mr. Jones added photographs and cuttings. The early history of the art of pottery, dating as far back as 150,000 years, the story of Egyptian pottery, and the various discoveries and inventions that have led to the work of art in this realm which we possess to day—these were all most delightfully described.

The various kinds of clays and other materials used in the production of terra-cotta, stone-ware, bone china, porcelain, etc. were explained; the different methods of glazing; the distinguishing characteristics of such types as Wedgwood, Pate-sur-pate, Rouge-de-flamme, these and many other interesting and fascinating stories were told to a most attentive audience.
