On Saturday, the mid-evening bulletin is scheduled at 9:25 p.m. EDT.

The Sunday schedule gives bulletins at approximately the same time intervals as the week-day service, i.e.: 8:00 a.m.; 9:00 a.m.; 11:00 a.m.; 12:55 p.m.; 2:57 p.m.; 6:45 p.m.; 8:00 p.m.; 11:00 p.m. and 11:57 p.m. EDT. The CBC has also scheduled the BBO News direct from London at 12:00 noon EDT, as well as the usual BBC News at 5:45 p.m. EDT. This BBC News service is now continued through Sundays.
