Glimpses of Neighbouring Towns ACTON Council goes on record as being definitely against the proposed County equalization assessments. Reasons cited: 1. Type and value of all buildings in Milton and all other municipalities are of a much better class than in Acton. 2. Local assessment in most cases is 100% of actual property value. 3. No paved roads in Acton, except Highway No. 7. 4. No sewage system in Acton. 5. Recommend an equalization basis, a comparison of sale prices of each property sold in each municipality during the past five years with the local assessment of said property. Council suggests that the equalization be left over till next year and that the Province appoint an independent assessor for the whole County.
