FEEDING DAIRY COWS ON PASTURE

Pasture provides the cheapest feed available for milk production, and it is highly desirable to provide cows with an abundance of fresh green herbage as long as possible throughout the pasture season.

On good pasture cows giving from 30 to 35 pounds of milk daily need very little grain. However, cows giving over this amount require one pound of meal for each three pounds of milk produced above it.
