W. F. Pickard, Musician, Dies Suddenly in Oakville

Native of Georgetown, Walter France Pickard died suddenly in Oakville, on Saturday, August 3rd. Born in Georgetown, Mr. Pickard moved to Toronto as a young man, and has since had a distinguished career in musical circles. For twenty years he was organist and choirmaster of Walmer Road Baptist Church, Mr. and Mrs. Walter Anthony remember him as a choirmaster at Brampton Baptist Church in 1889, when both of them sang in his choir there. Six years ago, he accepted a position as organist in a Port Arthur church, and since that time he had spent a summer vacation each year in Oakville. The funeral service was held from the home of his father-in-law, John Manley, on Tuesday, with burial in Clarkson Cemetery. He is survived by his widow, the former Isabel Mary, herself noted soprano singer of a decade ago. Mr. Pickard was a teacher at the Toronto Conservatory of Music for several years.

GEORGETOWN NATIVE DIES IN U.S.A.

Dr. Rolph Waldo Harrold, a native of Georgetown, died in Seattle, Washington, on July 23rd, at the home of his son, Ralph L. Harrold. Dr. Harrold, who was a dentist, was in his 32nd year. He was born on September 3rd, 1858, and married Sarah Ann Rose, also of Georgetown, in 1882. Surviving members of his immediate family, besides his wife and son are children Howard, Stanley, and Mrs. George F. Richardson; a sister, Mrs. Carrie Futtallo; and three brothers, Ben, Willis and Frank. He was a member of Oakville, Washington, Lodge No. 181, F. & A. M., and Camp No. 6441, M. W. A., Pullman, Washington. The funeral services were held on Friday, July 26th, from the Georgetown Undertaking Company in Seattle.

PROVINCE OF ONTARIO

AN APPEAL FOR ARMS

The Provincial Police of the Province of Ontario, acting under the direction of the Attorney-General, are co-operating with and advising municipalities now organizing or having organized Volunteer Civil Guards.

There is now an urgent need for arms with which to equip such guards under proper supervision and direction. Therefore, this appeal is being made to the citizens of Ontario asking that they loan for the use of the Volunteer Civil Guards any available rifles and 12 gauge shotguns, together with ammunition, for the purpose of protecting the lives, property and homes of our people. Such donations will be gratefully received, officially acknowledged and a proper record kept.

Arms may be deposited at the headquarters of the Volunteer Civil Guard, Parliament Buildings, Toronto, or with any Ontario Provincial Police Officer throughout the Province.
