GEN. ALBERT NORTH TELLS OF ARMY LIFE
 September 4th, 1946

The Georgetown Herald, Georgetown, Ontario.

Dear Sir:
 I wish to thank you for sending me your paper. It came the day I was leaving Oshawa for Petawawa, and though it was hard to leave all my friends behind, I was able to carry the Herald with me and read the news of Georgetown and my home-town of Oshawa, where I spent sixteen happy years.

It might be of interest to say I left Oshawa for Petawawa on Friday. I have seen such a large crowd of people as there were lined from the Barracks to the O.P.H. station, to give us their farewells as we marched to the station.

We were a very happy bunch of boys and I have been blessed with what I hope to be a long life. I will keep the chin up and smile. Stay when you are saying good-bye to your friends.

I had the happy privilege with seven of the other boys of taking the Oshawa paper and I hope I will have it. We stopped at the beautiful Hotel at Lindsay, "The Sun" and along with us was the Army Sergeant who applied the spring mattress with us.

We started out in the morning and stopped at several places of interest, through the village of Petawawa and through the woods of a large area. We would have liked to see the old station and its winding road and lines.
