JURY BRIBED WITH PROMISE OF DUCK SUPPLY GIVES "NOT GUILTY" VERDICT

Interest in Georgetown's first major court case of 1941 ran high last week, when Sam Walker, local contractor, faced a duck theft suit laid against him by M. H. Moyer, B.N. line farmer. A capacity crowd was on hand in St. George's Church hall on Thursday evening to hear the twisted mass of evidence which involved many prominent Georgetown residents.

The jury was composed of Ed. Hoare, Harry Mathews, Paul Barber, Mrs. Violet Bradley, R. Lacata, Ed. McWhirter, David Brill, Jack Stewart and J. L. Lambert, foreman. An innovation in court procedure, tried we believe for the first time in the history of British justice, was "biting the dust," administered by Court Clerk Elmer C. Ruzman. The witness told that this practice will soon be adopted in all Canadian courts.

Dr. Clifford Reid Popoff, prominent Georgetown pathologist gave evidence of blood-stains gathered from Walker's wooded and garbage pad, which revealed the tracks of a witness.
