**THE BIRDS**

In addition to keeping the weather records for the Meteorological Department, we have kept for our own satisfaction ever since coming to this neighborhood about 27 years ago, a record of the date of the first arrival of each kind of bird as we have heard or seen it.

This has proved a source of much interest and pleasure for it has kept our ears alert at all times for the sound of a new bird, and comparison of these yearly lists shows that the different kinds of birds arrive in much the same order every year and very often on the same date. In this way we have learned just about when to expect each new bird. For example the little house wren may be expected the first week of May, usually from the 4th to 7th.

In addition to our regular winter residents, that is a dozen or more that do not migrate, the first immigrant is the crow, for he does not go far south over in the Niagara peninsula where I originated, we used to see great flocks of them all winter, flying west in the morning and east at night to roost on islands in the Niagara River.

Ward Riddell, one of our most wide awake bird observers in this locality reports seeing the first crow this year, shortly after "ground-hog day" and also a song sparrow a week or so earlier, but we think that must have been one that got left in the usual fall migration.

The next one is usually the horned lark, more easily heard than seen, for he comes when the first bare patch of ground shows through the melting snow. Armand Swackhamer reports hearing them last week on the southern hills back of their place.

To get to know and enjoy the winter residents there is nothing better than doing our best to feed them. Chunks of suet hung in the branches of trees and shrubs about the house will soon be found by many of them. The first to find ours this winter was a pair of blue-jays, and they were hardly away before two or three pairs of chickadees were on the job. Then a pair of the downy woodpeckers, and a pair of nuthatches. These are the pretty little acrobats that spend so much of their time standing on their heads. Just once, so far, has the hairy woodpecker put in an appearance. He is very similar to the downy but nearly twice as large.

Then, too, we have had a half dozen junco coming quite regularly. They do not pay any attention to the suet, but prefer feeding on the ground, and for them we scatter on top of the snow some small seeds saved from under the threshing machine at threshing time. This we had intended for the pheasants, but apparently there are so many so-called rabbit hunters in this town that the pheasants are afraid to show their heads outside of the neighbouring swamps.

This neighborhood has been favored for some years past in having as a winter resident, that beautiful and comparatively rare bird the Kentucky cardinal. It was only occasionally, we heard them when down on the farm, but when we arrived in town last March and all through the summer they delighted us with their song and brilliant color. So far we have not seen nor heard of one being seen in town this winter, and would be glad to hear from any one who has seen one.

—How Hollywood sleuths missed finding some of these Georgetown Amateur Performers may explain why we see some poor screen shows these days. There will not be a dull moment at St. George's Sunday School room Friday, Feb. 21, at 8 p.m.
