FOR ONE - CANADA ONE FOR ALL AND ALL

"Canadians All," a series of programmes in the interest of Canadians other than those whose ancestry is British or French, is to be presented over the National Network of the CBC commencing Wednesday, February 26, at 10:30 to 11:00 p.m. EDT. There are over four million such Canadians - Ukrainian, Icelandic, Netherlands, Hungarian, Swedish, Finnish, Czech, Polish, Belgian, Italian, German and Norwegian, whose loyalty to Canada, and whose service on behalf of freedom and democracy is considerable. Many English and French speaking Canadians are unfamiliar with the honoured traditions of their fellow citizens, their great gifts of culture, heroism and steadfastness which are adding richness to the Canadian scene today and which will be part of the greater Canada of tomorrow.

Many of these Canadians of European ancestry are serving Canada in the war industries and the science laboratories of the Dominion, still others are in the woods, the mines, on the farms and at sea, providing the food and munitions vital to the cause to which Canada has pledged herself. The womenfolk are doing their share in the home economy, the social and war services.

Their loyalty and aspirations and the part they are playing in democracy's fight against oppression will be described during the broadcasts by one of their own members, speakers to all other Canadians. In the final programme of the series, Canadians of British and French descent will salute the citizens of the lineages represented in the other 12 broadcasts.

The programmes have been designed at the suggestion of the Director of Public Information and will include, besides descriptive narrative and music, a number of important speakers, representing Canadians all. The first programme, in honour of the Ukrainians in Canada, will be produced from Winnipeg on February 26. Geoffrey Waddington will conduct the music.

ST. DAVID'S DAY

In honour of the people of Wales, their descendants overseas and their heroes, the CBC will present a Saint David's day programme from Toronto on Saturday, March 1, at 7:30 to 7:45 p.m. EDT. The tribute in music and narrative, written by Aileen Beaufort, will recall the proud tradition of Britain's oldest allies, "those brave warrior bards, the Welsh." Deeds of brave renown and gifts of legend, speech and song mingle in the proud story of Wales.

Today, as the people of Wales stand fast with the people of Britain, holding their ground and uniting their efforts in the cause of freedom, they can look back into a distant antiquity for the roots of their culture, which they do not intend to surrender.

It is as natural for a Welsh child to sing as it is for him to play. His ancestors attended their first Eisteddfod in 1461, but long before that, the bays and strains of the song were heard from mountain and valley, in cottage and hall, wherever the cherished Welsh tongue was spoken. Singers and actors of Welsh descent will participate in the broadcast.

"NORTH WEST MOUNTED" STARRS COOPER, CARROLL

Gary Cooper and Madeleine Carroll, cast in the sort of romantic roles which brought them to screen fame - he as Dusty Rivers, a Texas Ranger, and she as April Logan, a gallant nurse - are the starring duo who head the huge cast of Cecil B. DeMille's "Northwest Mounted Police," which Paramount will present on Saturday at the Gregory Theatre.

In keeping with the magnitude of his stars DeMille has assembled an outstanding group of players. Heading the list are Paulette Goddard, cast as Louvette, fascinating, tempestuous Indian girl; and Preston Foster and Robert Preston as Sergeant Jim Brett and Ronnie Logan, Mounted Police men. As a basis for his plot, Mr. DeMille has selected the famous Riel incident - the attempt of Louis Riel, played by Francis McDonald in the picture, and thousands of half-breeds under his leadership to run the Mounted Police out of Canada and to govern themselves.
