It would be a non-profit, community effort based upon cooperative, self help. Financial prosperify of the plan would mean, not dividends to stockholders, but increas-

ed benefits to subscribers. The Pian calls for enrolment of employed workers in groups at the lowest possible monthly rate of subscription compatible with actuarial soundness. By arrangement with the employer this weekly or monthly fee to be deducted

from wages. In return the worker would be entitled to complete hospitalisation for himself and any member of the family in case of need, and would have the assurance that the hospital bill would be paid by the plan without financia worry or burden to himself.
