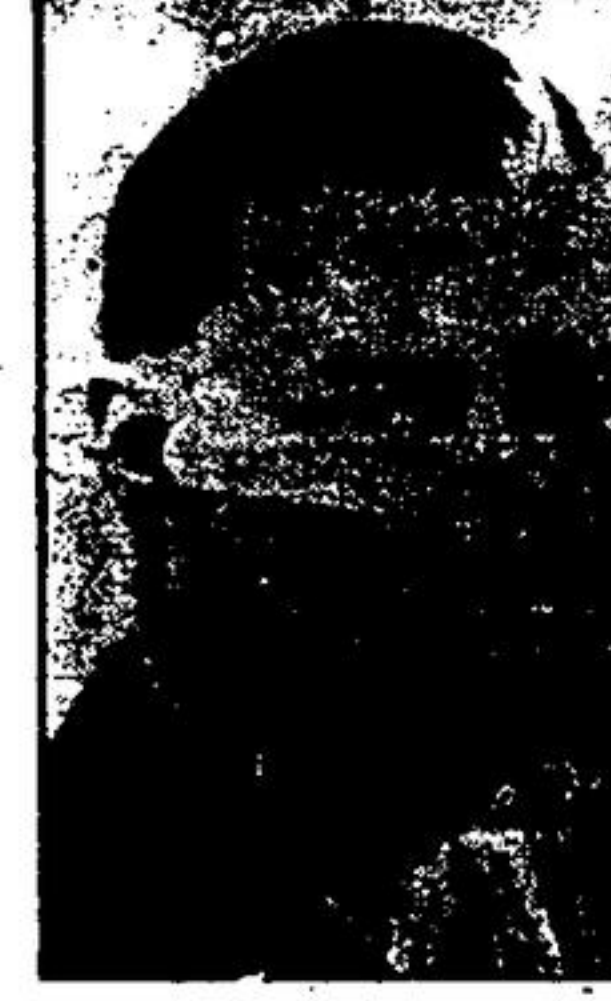

### Your Announcer Is



DON WILSON

Don Wilson, one of the biggest men in Canadian radio—height 6 ft. 1 in., weight 225 lbs.—found his vocation under the big top when he was 12 years old. It wasn't the usual circus bug that bit him—trapeze bands, death defying darlings, lion cages and all that, but a radio exhibit, the first one ever to be seen in a small prairie town.

Don decided on the spot to own one of the amazing contraptions himself. His technical ignorance hadn't a chance against his perseverance and imagination. In two years he was one of the most important citizens in his native Leaskburn, Saskatchewan, important because he was the only person in the town operating a real live transmitter and receiving set. His fame spread through the whole west a short time later when he was successful in contacting a far north Royal Canadian Mounted Police station which had been trying to get word through of the discovery of the wrecked plane and bodies of the men of the Crutchbank party—the tragic end of a great incident in Canadian pioneer flying.

By the time Don was finished high school he had decided upon radio as a career. His first step was a course in wireless, followed by two years at sea as a wireless operator, two years that Don, like all the rest who have experienced a stretch on the brine, wouldn't trade for a lifetime of land-lubbing.

He went ashore at Vancouver to play his part in the early drama of broadcasting—he was engineer, announcer, producer, salesman, yes, and did a bit of dusting when visitors were expected. He staged a programme which remains a highlight in Canadian broadcasting: "Wings Over Canada" was the first broadcast of a full orchestra from an aeroplane. Two years later he moved on to Kamloops to stir up the radio pot there, but he was on the table too often, and he hid himself back to Vancouver in 1935. That year he joined the CBC after taking part in the year's special event best—he announced the programme honouring the visit of the Lord Mayor of London. First he was a producer and then chief announcer at the CBC Vancouver studios. He was one of the originators of the lively "Stag Party." Composers, authors, singing stars and famous orchestra leaders were his "guests" and early familiarity with visiting celebrities in the next four years prepared him for the assignment that topped all others in broadcasting history in this country—the Royal Visit of 1939.
