Public Meeting Will Discuss Formation of Civil Defence League

A public meeting will be held in the Public Library next Tuesday evening, May 20th, commencing at 8.30 p.m. to discuss the formation of a Civil Defence League in Georgetown. This idea, which is being fostered by the St. John Ambulance Brigade, is patterned along the lines of A.R.P. work in England, and aims at acquainting people with the ways of combating fire caused by incendiary bombs, first-aid, and other relative safeguards during war-time.

A delegation interview Council at their meeting last week, and received the whole-hearted cooperation of the Mayor and Councilors with the scheme. At next week's meeting, Mr. T. M. West, Corps Superintendent of Toronto, will be present to explain the set-up and answer questions concerning it. If enough interest is shown, it is planned to go ahead with the organization.
