Books which would fail to meet the pleasure of the Nazi authorities would be burned or banned.

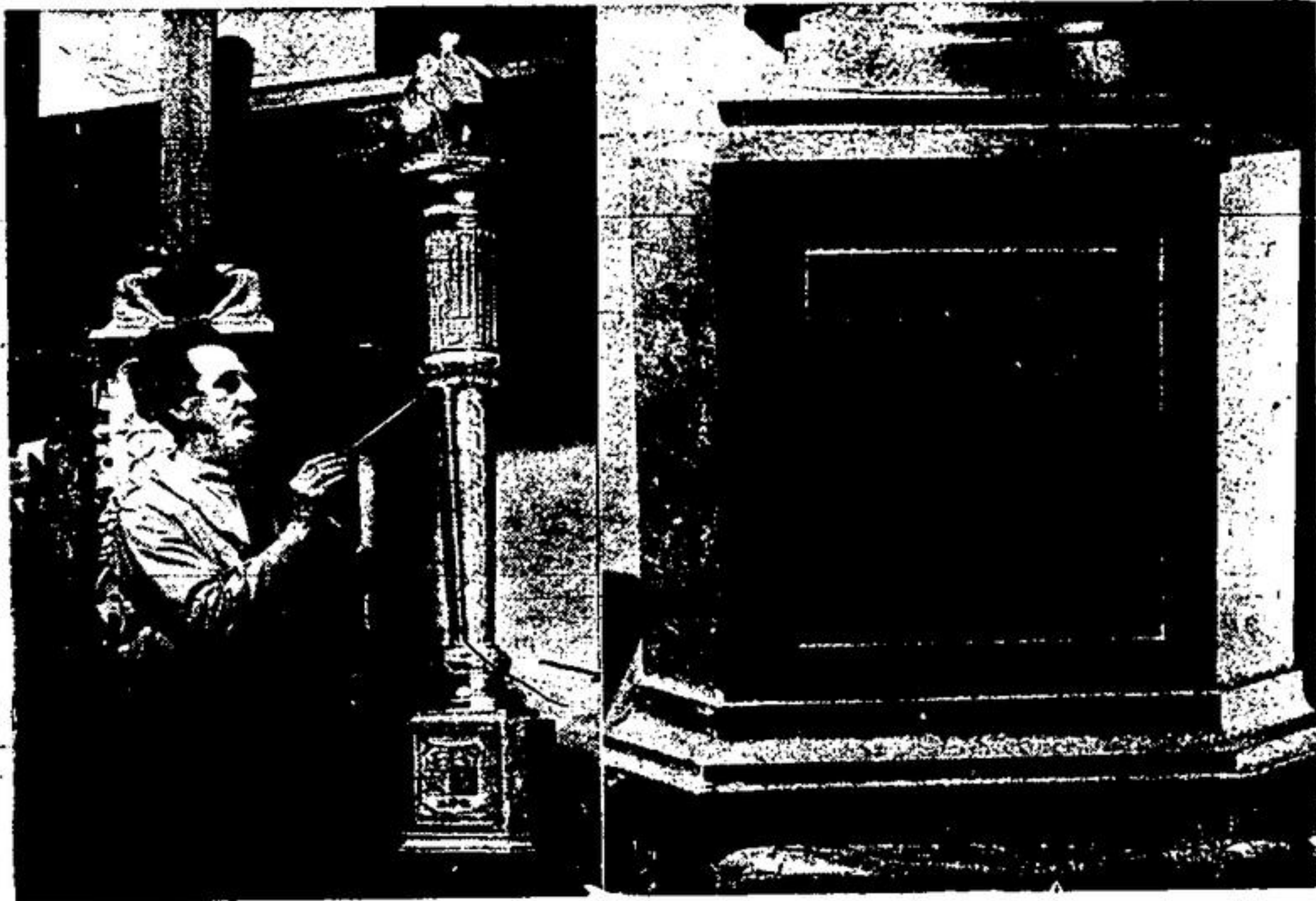
Private telephones, if permitted would be subject to "tapping" by Nazi agents.

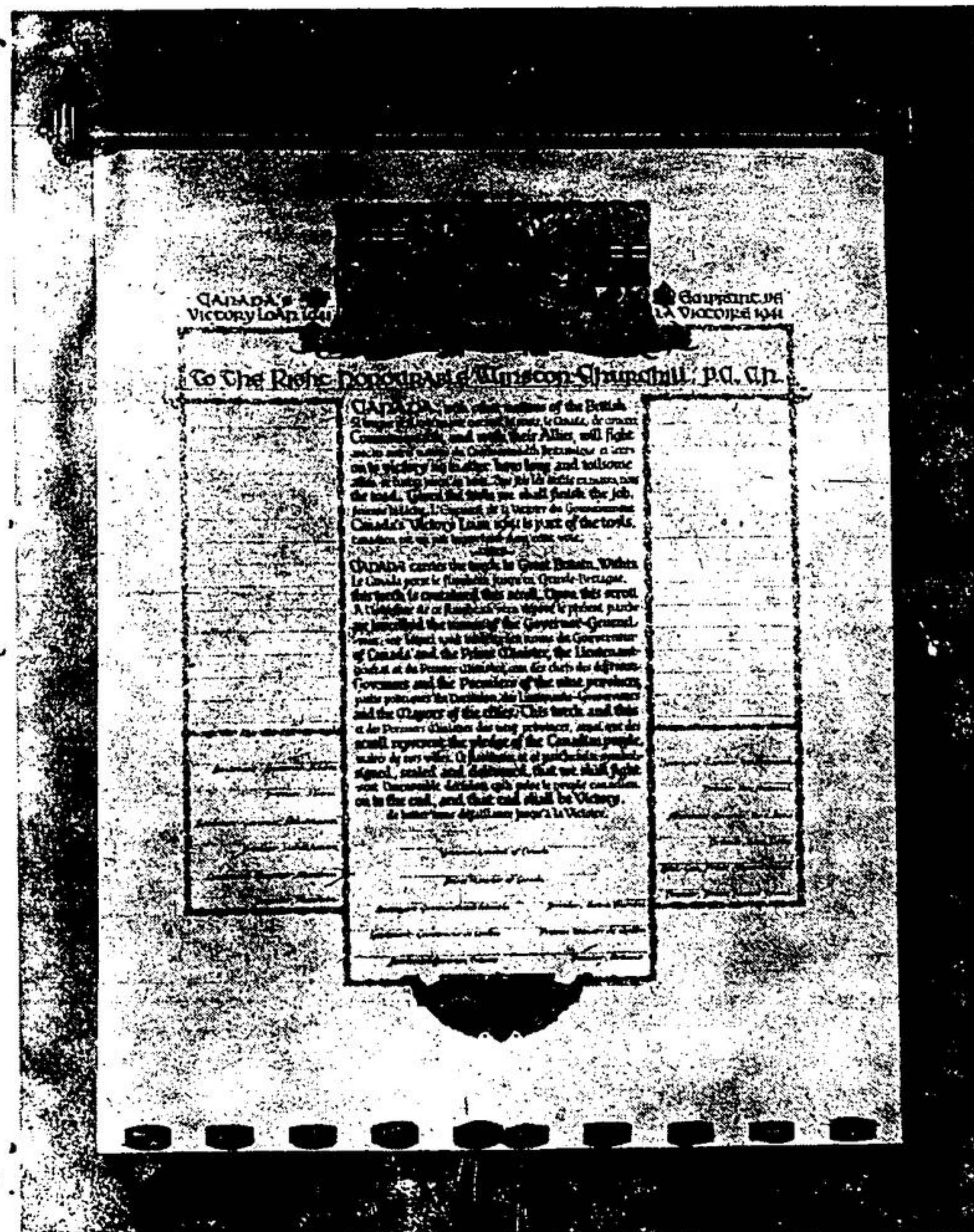
## TORCH TO CHURCHILL ON ITS WAY



The symbolic torch which Canadians are flying to Prime Minister Winston Churchill left Victoria, B.C., on May 24th, and is stopping at important Canadian cities on its way across Canada. On Saturday, June 7th, it arrived at Malton airport, and was brought to Brampton for a torch day ceremony at Clegg Park. On Sunday, one hundred thousand Toronto citizens jammed Riverdale Park, where Lieut. Col. the Rev. Sidney Lambert, Christie Street Hospital padre, was chief speaker.

Above, artist Ted Watson is shown with the completed Torch, constructed from materials distinctly Canadian. The base is made of maple, the shaft of Canadian pine, and the whole is finished with 23 carat gold leaf. At right is shown the inscription on the base: "Canada's Victory Loan 1941—Part of the Tools."

## Master Scroll for Victory Loan Torch



Here is the Master Scroll which accompanies the Torch on its way across Canada and thence over the Atlantic for presentation to Prime Minister Winston Churchill as a symbol of Canada's loyal determination to fight on until victory has been won. Besides containing a message to the British leader, the Scroll will also contain the signatures of Federal, Provincial and Municipal officials. The Scroll will be contained in a specially-constructed cylinder which has been built into the shaft of the Torch. Addressed to the Right Honourable Winston Churchill and written in both English and French, the text of the Scroll reads:

"Canada, with other nations of the British Commonwealth and their Allies, will fight on to victory no matter how long and toilsome the road. Given the tools we shall finish the job. Canada's Victory Loan, 1941, is part of the tools."

"Canada carries the Torch of Great Britain. Within this Torch is contained this Scroll. Upon this Scroll are inscribed the names of the Governor-General of Canada and the Prime Minister, the Lieutenant-Governors and the Premiers of the nine provinces and the Mayors of the cities. This Scroll and this Torch represent the pledge of the Canadian people, signed, sealed and delivered, that we shall fight on to the end and that the end shall be Victory."
