TOXOID CAMPAIGN

(AGAINST DIPHTHERIA)

- An effort is being made to have every child (from 6 months to high school age) protected against Diphtheria. This appeal is directed particularly to parents of pre-school children. The response of school age children has been excellent; 90% of last year's public school pupils are protected.
- The treatment consists of 3 inoculations, one every 3 weeks, and for children is practically painless with no unpleasant after effects.
- Under present war conditions the mobilization of men from all parts of this country and other countries where immunization has not been used, favours development of epidemics. Last winter severe outbreaks of Diphtheria occurred in Halifax and St. Thomas. Public health authorities are doing all possible to prevent repetition this year by encouraging immunization of all children as well as members of the armed forces.
- It is recommended that parents take their children to their family physician, or at a clinic, being held at the Public School, Friday, October 17th, at 1.30 p.m.
