A CHEQUE for \$247.78 was forwarded this week to the Telegram B.W.V. Fund from readers of the Georgetown Herald. Included in the total was \$183.16 specially earmarked for Christmas Cheer for British Children. It has been cheering to see the way this district has responded by making donations to bring the Christmas Spirit into Britain's homes. It is impossible to comment on all the donations.
