**"No Toy" Say District Kangaroo-Viewers**

5th Line Man Saw Kangaroo Last Month, and No Feeding  
 For the past few weeks, a main topic of conversation in this district has been the report of a kangaroo seen on the 5th Line recently. The Herald editor has been "asleep at the switch" as it were and let the city dailies scoop him on this unusual story, but this week we have finally made some enquiries and hope that our story is "better late than never."  
 To begin with, there was a kangaroo, and not the toy one that an Australian airman lost on a train in Quebec. This fact has been corroborated in conversation with Mrs. D. J. Immond, who relates the story in this way: Early in May, Mr. and Mrs. Immond's son, Bruce, and James Rae, who was employed on their farm at the time, were working in a field when they were amazed to see a queer animal hopping along the 10th Line Highway. Mr. Rae, who has seen kangaroos at the zoo, is quite willing to swear that the animal was a kangaroo, and Bruce backs him up in this.

His tracks could be followed into the bush, but that was the last trace seen. The men report that the kangaroo moved with amazing rapidity and easily outdistanced the dog. At the time of the kangaroo's appearance in this district, there were reports that some Australian airman, training in this country, had lost a pet kangaroo from a troop train in Quebec, and it was thought this might be their wandering pet. It was later reported that the story was only a "gag" and that it was only a toy kangaroo that the airman had lost.  
 Anyway, the fact remains that someone has lost a kangaroo, but from the reported speed of the creature, it will probably be many miles from here by now. Perhaps we'll hear more of the story one of these days.
