### NEW EDITION OF MCKIM'S DIRECTORY NOW OFF PRESS

Canada has three more publications than it had at this time last year, though the dailies have decreased by five and the weeklies by 31 the losses being compensated by 20 new monthlies and 23 new miscellaneous publications.

These figures are from the 25th edition of McKim's Directory of Canadian Publications, just issued. Chinese publications lead, among the dailies in the foreign language field of 68 publications in 16 languages; the Chinese have four dailies, two in British Columbia. Disappearance of the two Japanese dailies leaves the Japanese with only one publication, a weekly.

The Directory, comprising 482 pages, includes extensive data on markets throughout Canada. "Since the war began, advertising has been used more extensively than ever before in history to further the mobilization of national resources," says C. T. Pearce, President of A. McKim Limited, in his Foreword. "Advertising which takes the long view has always been the most effective advertising. Today, the view must be still further lengthened. Those who, with their eyes on the post-war

world, take the necessary steps to maintain and increase the goodwill created by consistent advertising will find themselves in the best position to cope with circumstances when peace comes."

## Hubert Hunter Dies After Long Illness

Rev. C. C. Cochran conducted the funeral services this Wednesday afternoon for Hubert Hunter, who passed away at his Glen Road home, Monday, June 15th, after a long illness.

Mr. Hunter was born in Norwich, England, 75 years ago, a son of Mr. and Mrs. William Hunter. In 1876, the family came to Canada and settled on a farm near Brampton. Deceased was employed in the Norval Mills, Norval, for a great number of years before moving to this community 17

years ago. In 1883 he married the late Phoebe Oatlander, from Huttonville. They had five sons and two daughters: Hubert, at Norval, Stanley in Washington, D.C., Nixon and Clarence, Chicago, Illinois and Andrew in Georgetown. One daughter, Matilda Clara, Miss McEgan, lives in Toronto, and the other daughter, Rose Greta, William (David's) lives in Port Colborne.

In the year 1926, he married Margaret Davidson Maw, and for the past 17 years she and her husband have been living at their home on the Glen Road, part of which they converted into the well-known "Hunter's Inn" 8 years ago.

Mr. Hunter is also survived by one sister, Mrs. Bernice Treadwell, at Kingston, and one brother, Herbert, Seattle, Washington.

The funeral was held at the residence, Glen Road, on Wednesday, June 17th, at 2:30. Interment was in Huttonville Cemetery.
