Local Boys in Dieppe

The R.C.E. Invalided home July 1941. Mrs. B. Francis received the following telegram last Saturday afternoon: "Sincerely regret to inform you EDWIC, Cpl. Edward Frank Francis, officially reported missing in action. Further information follows when received." "Edwic" as he is familiarly known, enlisted with the Royal Hamilton Light Infantry the morning after war was declared in September, 1939. Prior to enlistment he was a valued employee of Provincial Paper Limited, for 10 or 11 years. He took an active interest in town affairs and was a Fireman, a member of the L. O. L. and belonged to the Masonic Order. For a number of years he was bass drummer in the Lorne Scots Pipe Band. Before enlisting for Active Service, he trained for 13 years with the Lorne Scots militia and obtained the rank of Sergeant with the unit. However, when he joined in Hamilton, he had to start out with private's ranking once more. While with the R.H.L.I. he received his training at Hamilton and Camp Borden and went overseas in July, 1940.

An only brother, Lance-Corporal Henry Francis was killed in action in the last Great War on June 17, 1915. Saturday morning brought news to another Georgetown family, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Lane. The telegram read as follows: "Sincerely regret to inform you B51845, Pte. Gordon Wesley Lane, officially reported wounded in action. Shrapnel wounds of the face. Further information follows when received." Gordon enlisted with the Lorne Scots in April, 1941, trained in Hamilton and went overseas the following June. He worked at Harley-Kay Ltd. before enlistment. He was actively interested in sports and played hockey consecutively with the Midgets, Juveniles and Juniors. He also played on the Georgetown baseball team. Monday night brought good news to an anxious household. A cable was received from Gordon himself saying "Injured and in hospital and illness not serious; letters sent."

Other townspeople received telegrams telling them their men were safe. Mr. Wm. Connelly had word that his brother, Pte. Robert, of the R.H.L.I. had taken part in the Dieppe raid and had come out safely. On Friday, Mrs. Keith Spence received a cable from her husband, Pte. Keith Spence, of the Lorne Scots, saying he was safe. Mrs. Dickenson, Stewarttown, received word from Ottawa Tuesday night that her son Pte. Harry Dickenson is missing following operations at Dieppe.

Georgetown is not the only town to suffer through the Dieppe raid. Other Halton boys killed in the list to date are Pte. Robert Henry Messon, Oakville, and Pte. William Lyle Turner, Acton, Ontario, who was a member of the R.H.L.I.

Our heartfelt sympathy goes out to the families of all these boys. These are anxious days for all and we find comfort in knowing what they have endured will pave the way for ultimate victory.
