Town of Georgetown

A By-law providing for the early closing of shope in the Town of Georgelown

WHEREAB by Bedian #3 of Pectories, Shops and Office Building Act, R.BO 1997, Ch. 154, by-laws may be passed by the Councils of Local Municipalities, providing for the early closing of all or any class or classes of steps within the Municipality.

AND WHEETERS the Council has deemed it expedient to accede to the petitions of the occupants of certain clause of shops to regulate the hours of cloreng and to puss the following by-law regulating the hours of clos- 24 true of all shops statute the mumicipality as affected by the provisions of the above Act, except as hereinafter spectficulty provided

NOW, THEREDELL, The Corporation of the Town of Oronyctown by the Council, and pursuant to Section 82 of The Partories, Ithone and Office Buildings Act. R.BO 1937, Chapter 194 for the month of September :and amendments thereto, ENACTE AS POLLOWD: -

1. Every shop as defined by the prositions of the said Art shall be closed by the occupiers or occupants thereof from and after the hours heretrafter specified and shall remain closed until the hour of the o'clock the following morning and on Baturday until the hour of five o'clock the folfollowing Monday morning with the following exception.

(a) The above shops shall not be reguired to close until the hour of 10 p.m. during the period from December 15th to December 34th inclusive, or on the day immediately preceding a legal

holiday. The hours of closing thall be as folloss: Monday, Tursday, Wednesday and Friday 630 pm. Thursday 1230 pm. Baturday 1000 pm

Excelving Hairdrening Establishmen's and Beauty Parlours, which on Tureday and Wednesday shall close and remain closed after the hour of 800 pm invited of 830 pm and of Priday shall close and remain closed after the hour of 1000 pm. and in other respects shall be governed by the provisions of this by-law, and Burber Strops which will be covered under another by-law.

2. The provisions of this by-law shall not apply to the following class or clavers of shops. Pool-rooms, garagre, coal and lumber offices, restaur-

Any person convicted of a breach of any provision of this by-law shall forfelt and pay at the discretion of the convicting magistrate, a penalty not exceeding (exclusive of costs) the sum of Pifty Dollars (\$50 00) for each offence and in default of payment of the and penulty and costs forthwith, the said penalty and costs or costs only may be levied by distress on the goods and chattels of the offender and in the case of there being no distress found, the convicting magistra's may commit the offender to the common jall of the County of Halton with or without hard labour for any period not exceeding twenty-one days.

BY-LAW No. 428

Town of Georgetown

A By-law providing for the early closing of barber shops, within the Town of Georgetown

WHEREAS by Section 62 of the Pactories, Shops and Office Buildings Act and ameritments thereto, by-laws may be passed by the councils of local municipalities for the early closing of certain clauses of shops within the

AND WHEREAS a potition has been presented to the municipal council of th Corporation of Corpotown requesteng the early closing of barber shops, dened by three quarters of the occupters or occupants of shops within the municipality belonging to the above Massification

AND WHEREAS the council has deemed it expedient to accede to the above potition.

NOW, THEREPORE, The Corpor-etton of the Town of Georgotown by its Council and in pursuance of Bection 82 of the Pactories, Shops and Office Buildings Act, R.S.O., Chapter 194 and amendments thereto enacts as

1. Every barber shop, whether carried on in a shop or private residence shall be closed by the occupiers or occupants the good from and after the hour of six o'cook in the evening of each Monday, Tuesday and Priday and from and after the hour of ten o'clock in the evening of each Wednesday and Baturday and from and after the hour of 12.30 noon of each Thursday with

(a) When a public holiday is observof the previous night shall be ten

o'clock in the evening. 2. Each at up and residence above specified shall be closed from and after the hours above named and shall remain closed until the hour of seven o"clock of the following morning and on Saturday of the next Monday morning.

3. Provided, however, that this shall not prevent the completion of any work commenced before the hours above specified for closing. 4. Any person convicted of a breach

of any of the provisions of this by-haw shall forfest and pay at the discre-

tion of the convicting magistrate, a penalty not exceeding (exclusive costs) the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each offence and in default of payment of the said penalty and costs forthwith, the said penalty and costs or costs only may be lievied by distress on the goods and chattels of the offender and in the case of there being no distress found, the convicting mugistrate may commit the offender to the common bull of the County of Hakon with or without hard labour for any period not exceeding beenty-
