PRISONERS-OF-WAR PARCELS
Although the Red Cross has accomplished many wonderful things, and much could be written of its work, one great task stands out, that of assembling, packing and shipping food parcels to prisoners-of-war.

Nearly two million parcels have already gone over from Canada and the Canadian Red Cross has undertaken shipment of 70,000 food parcels each week for British Empire prisoners in Europe. The contents of these parcels are based on expert, nutritional and medical advice and are packed in Canadian cities by volunteers, some of whom now pray that parcels may reach their sons.

Sometimes we are inclined to doubt

whether these parcels ever reach destination, but this week we have positive proof that a boy from our own home town is receiving these parcels. Mrs. B. Francis' son, whom we all know as Eddie, has written his mother as follows:

Sept. 12th, 1942.

Dear Mother:
I'm afraid I haven't got much to write about, other than to let you know that I am keeping well and healthy. We got a Red Cross parcel twice a week which keeps us fairly well fed. So if the Red Cross ever comes to the door never refuse to help them. If you want to send me anything it must be clothing and not food. You can also send tobacco and cigarettes, tobacco preferred. Well, Ma, I hope this letter finds you all in good health and not worrying over me, as I am O.K.

Anything you want to know get in touch with the Red Cross. My prison address is: Cpl Edward Francis, 2510, 1st Mainline St. W. 1111, Deutschland (Allermann). Maybe your contribution has made this possible. At least it is comforting to know that we have helped to make the going a little easier for some mother's son, who gave up his freedom and was willing to give his life. Just we might be free.
