

THE PRICE OF ORANOES-Last week-end newspapers and radio carried announcements that there would be a drastic reduction in the retail price of Oranges. Of course consumers expected a reduction in price to go into effect first thing Monday morning. Actually all reductions had previcusly taken place due to market declines and the removal of the duty on Oranges on December 1. Since November 2 of this year there has been a decline of from 10c to 15c a doz. in our Orange prices. Any further declines in cost will be followed immediately by decline in retail prices.

TEA AND COPPEE--In accordance with the W.T.P.B. regulations the prices of all brands of Teas and Coffees have been dropped in our stores 10c a lb. on Tea and 4c a lb. on Coffee, with a corresponding decline on smaller packages.
