ELECTED MAYOR FOR TENTH TERM

ACTING-SERGEANT H. S. TOFT

Who was one of Georgetown's first casualties in this war, Sgt. Toft was killed on manoeuvres in England on June 15, 1942. "His name liveth forever".

When the Esqueving Township Council was returned by acclamation, Reeve Howard May began his second term as Township reeve.



SGT. L. M. CLARK

A former member of the Herald staff, Sgt. Leslie Clark graduated as a wireless air gunner and after a term with the Ferry Command, went overseas in the Pull. A recent letter to his family told them he was at Gibraltar.



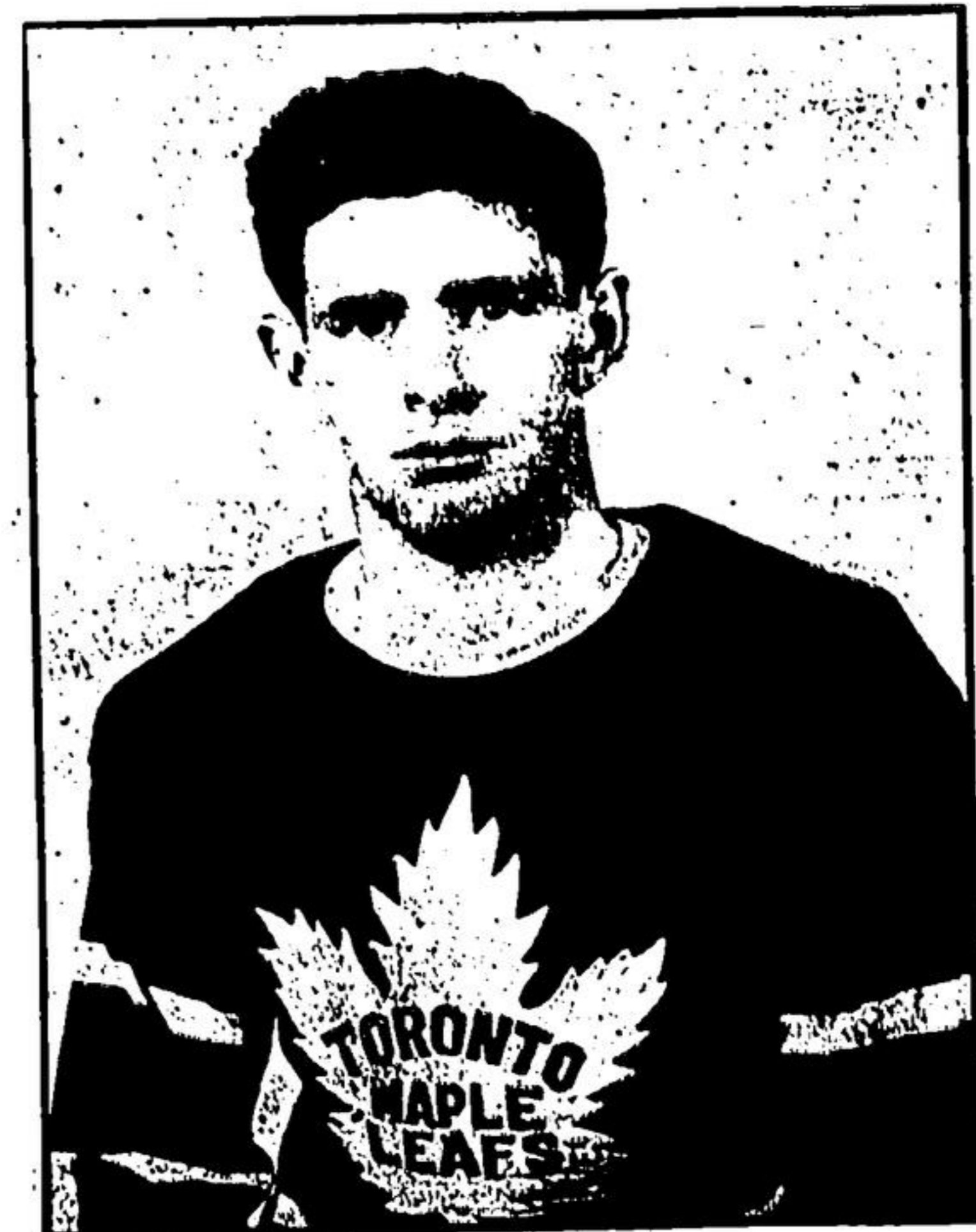
HUGHES CLEAVER, M. P.
