**AVOID THESE MISTAKES:**

- Never place your telephone on the wall but use a table or desk. Keep it on a wide, level surface that the cord does not loop over the drawer handle or knob. Opening the drawer may pull the telephone over causing damage.
- Keep your telephone cord unknotted—untwisted.
- When plugging, protect your telephone with a cloth or paper. When washing floors or get soaked with water. Be sure that the cord does not get wet.
- Always replace the receiver carefully. Be sure it is placed correctly on its support. Do not use a "bus" signal. Do not use a pencil or other sharp point when changing and damage the dial and cause a wrong number as well.
