To the Members of Halton County Council:

Gentlemen:

In last week's Herald (see Hornby news) it was reported that Halton County Council had passed a motion asking for the opening of a liquor store in Milton. We presume this is correct? In any case we make no apology for once again reminding you and all Halton County citizens of a few statements on this question of liquor drinking which comes from the pens not (please note) of temperance reformers but of men upon whom has rested the responsibility of guarding the health and welfare of the community in which they were chosen to serve.

A consideration of the standing of each of those writers quoted, in his particular field of community welfare study, we suggest should exclude any controversy as to the reliability of these statements which we append.

I.—"There is agreement among students and teachers of the Medical and associated sciences that: Beverage Alcohol Impairs Reason, Will, Self Control, Judgment, Physical Skill, and Endurance." (From "Alcohol—Its Effects on Man" Haven Emerson M.D., Prof. of Public Health Practice, Columbia University).

II.—"Alcohol is the lubricant of the facilitation process. It enables the wheels of facilitation with smoothed and despatch relentlessly to hasten healthy citizens to ill-health and misfortune." (Col. Donald H. Williams—Director of Federal Venereal Disease Control Division. Quoted in Globe and Mail article June 29th, 1943, "Facilitate: His Facilitated by Alcohol" by Ken W. McCusker).

III.—"Let it be urged as a simple economic truth that no amount of subsequent revenue which is derived from the liquor traffic will ever compensate for the original misdirection of the outlay.

I can speak for every earnest student on this question when I say we would willingly abandon every copper of the revenue in the sure knowledge that the saving to the State on the transaction, would be immediate and substantial.

Be it remembered that this outlay involves considerable expense on police, in the provision of poor-houses and asylums, and innumerable other directions in the social services. There is therefore not the slightest validity in the argument that the revenue derived, is for one moment important. We could abandon every copper of it to-night, and, regarded as a plain business proposition, earn a substantial social and financial profit."
