FREE ISSUE OF HONOUR ROLL PROVES POPULAR IN CANADA

OTTAWA—The attractive Honour Roll, issued free of charge to churches, educational institutions, factories, clubs, fraternal societies and other organizations for the purpose of recording the names of the men and women who have volunteered for ACTIVE SERVICE in the armed forces, is meeting with a wonderful reaction on the part of the public. Headquarters announced recently.

The Honour Roll is artistically designed and it symbolizes in striking and authentic heraldic form the historic majesty of the British Empire.

The basic MOTIF is the Canadian coat-of-arms with flanking shields showing the maple-leaf of Canada, the shamrock of Ireland, the thistle of Scotland, the rose of England and the fleur-de-lis of old France.

In the design on the base are the heraldic flags of the NAVY, ARMY and the AIR FORCE. The colouring is rich and the whole is reproduced by a special process.

The Honour Rolls are in various sizes, namely for 12, 24, 48, 96 and 192 names, and it is pointed out that they may be obtained ONLY by writing to the DIRECTOR OF ARMY RECRUITING, AVIATION BUILDING, OTTAWA. While these Honour Rolls are issued under the supervision of the Directorate of Army Recruiting it



is explained that they are for the names of the men and women of the NAVY, ARMY and AIR FORCE—without distinction—on ACTIVE SERVICE. The name of the church, school or business together with the size of the Roll required should be clearly stated on the application.
