**"As We See It"**

THE FINAL figure for the Fifth Victory Loan were released last week and the grand total was \$1,382,276,350, or in other words just under fourteen hundred million. It means quite a lot of money. The most interesting part of the announcement is that the cost of the loan. This set a new record. Each hundred dollars raised in the first Victory Loan cost the Dominion one dollar and nine cents. The second and third Victory Loans cost just over ninety eight cents for each hundred dollars raised and the fourth loan was sold at a cost of ninety two cents per hundred dollars. The cost of the fifth Victory Loan is around eighty eight cents for each hundred dollars worth of bonds sold. As each loan has in turn been larger than the former one it looks as though the same total costs are undertaken to float the loan regardless of its size. We understand that the next loan is expected to be on the market in April of 1944.

**STRIKES ARE STILL** the order of the day. It remained for the City of Montreal to stage a new variety through The Firemen and the City Police went on strike down there for part of one day last week. We had an idea that Public servants, such as those mentioned, were above that sort of thing, however as usual, we are mistaken. We wonder if strikers have any brothers, sons, or daughters overseas, and if they have, we wonder if they have the nerve to write to them telling them of what they are doing. No doubt many of the strikers are on strike merely because of the fact that they belong to some organization and if that particular group decides to go on strike they have to follow suit whether they really are in favor of striking or not. As strikers are usually staged in an attempt to get more money we know what the boys overseas think of such tactics. They are away from home and from loved ones and are working for a good deal less than the strikers are getting. In fact the boys overseas are protecting those same strikers and are enabling them to even have a job. Let us suppose that one of the men on strike has a brother or son overseas and when that person returns we would think that the man that had gone on strike would be awfully proud to tell his returned brother that when he was fighting over there that he here at home had gone on strike for more money. **Back in Jail After Four Days in Zero Weather**

Charles Ferrer, 18, who escaped from Milton County jail in Milton last Wednesday was captured in an almost semi-conscious condition Sunday evening.

Ferrer was found hiding in the hay-mow of a barn on the farm of Lloyd Chisholm, Esqueving township, five miles west of Milton, officers said. "I noticed some hay disturbed in the mow and on investigation found Ferrer hiding in a hole," Chisholm told police. "He was very weak and offered no resistance when I took him to Milton and turned him over to the provincial police," he said.

Ferrer escaped last Wednesday while engaged in cleaning the corridor of the court house, according to officers. "He told us he remained in hiding until Thursday night, when he went to a nearby house for food," officers stated. "When he found no one at home, he returned to the Chisholm barn and remained there until found."

"During the four days, the man had neither food nor water, and was very weakened from exposure," Provincial Constable E. R. Leman stated.

Ferrer was being held without bail on a charge of robbery with assault on Edward Cates, 77, Campbellville. The injured man is in a Hamilton hospital in a critical condition, according to the police.
