There were 125 present, at the largest attendance yet recorded at a meeting of this club, when President A. T. Woodley, Milton, called the meeting to order, following a sumptuous banquet. W. F. Watson, Assistant Director of the Ontario Livestock Branch, was the principal speaker. He outlined the goals set for agriculture during 1944. A. V. Langton, Holstein Director of Extension, and A. M. Barr, Feldman, also spoke briefly.
