High School Board Meets

Georgetown High School Board held their regular monthly meeting on Monday evening, Feb. 14th, with chairman Archdeacon W. G. O. Thompson in the chair. The minutes of the last regular meeting and emergent meeting were read and confirmed. Accounts amounting to \$191.15 were presented and passed to be paid.

Venerable Thompson having served the usual two years as chairman of the Board thanked the members for their hearty co-operation during his term of office.

Mr. Dayfoot moved a vote of appreciation for Ven. Thompson's faithful and efficient services as chairman. This motion was seconded by Mr. R. B. Foulis and heartily responded to by members present.
