Saturdays there will be dancing at the Park from 8.30 p.m. to 12 o'clock. Johnny Boyd and his orchestra will dispense the music on these nights.

special midnight Frolic Dances arranged by the management.

Huttonville Park is situated three miles west of Brampton on the Credit River and Chinguacousy Lake. It is one of the natural beauty spots of Peel County. The Park offers special facilities for dances during the summer season. It also offers ideal bathing for adults, a separate and safe bathing pool for the kiddies, baseball grounds, horse shoe courts, swings, fishing, boating—in fact everything to make your picnic or dance a splendid success. Picnic tables are set up in the shade of beautiful trees, and there is a pavilion for shelter in case of rain. Parking facilities are available on the grounds.

This kind of programme has proven highly popular in many centres throughout Ontario.

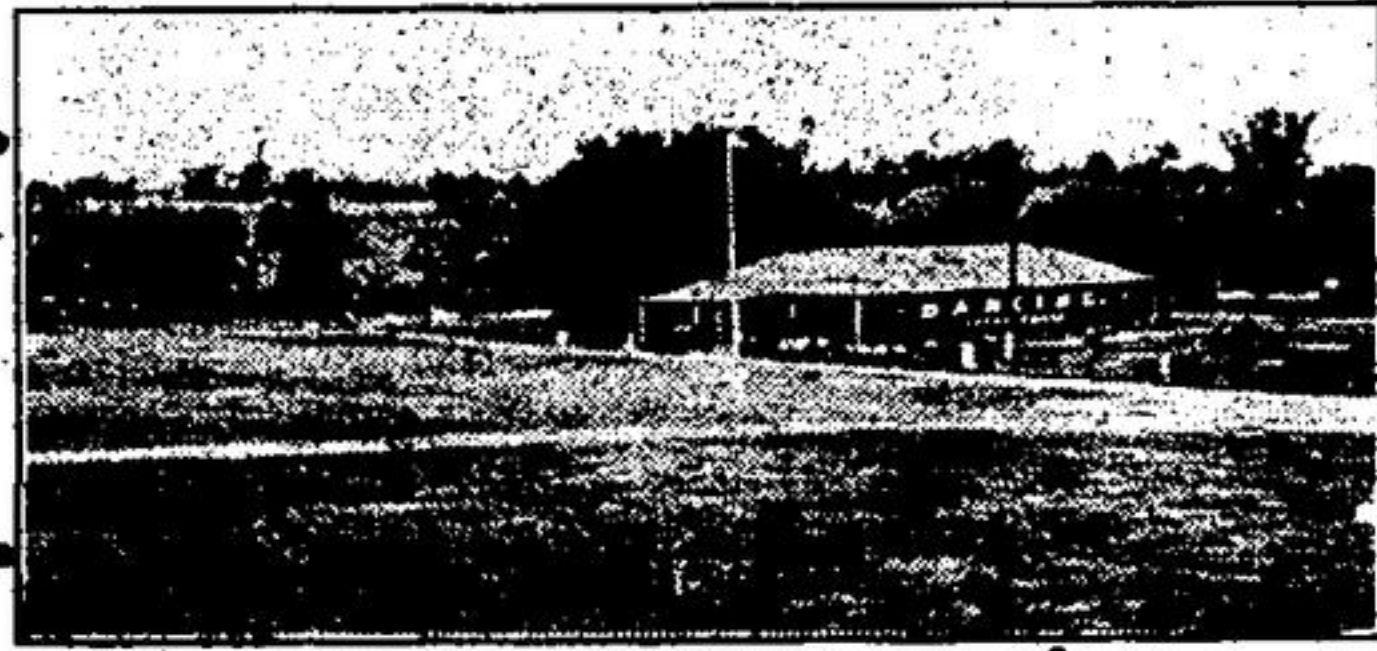
Dance Pavillion Renovated at Popular Park
