ELECTRIC STOVES

Production of electric stoves, ranges and grills this year will not reach the totals given in a recent report which was based on an announcement made last March 22, M. C. Lowe, Prices Board administrator of Capital Equipment and Electrical Products, pointed out recently.

Since the March 22 announcement was made, there has been upward revision of Canada's heavy shell program the Board explained, with the result that the quantities of electric stoves, ranges and grills which can be made this year will be considerably below the original estimate because the steel will not be available.
