## Legion Notes

The local branch of the Canadian Legion were represented by the following delegates to attend the Zone meeting which was held in Port Credit, last Sunday: Past Zone Commander Col. Cousens; Past President Fred McCarty; President Harold Stalford; Comrade Wm. Roney and J. Boley. Also in the party was Honorary President, L. E. Fleck.

The delegates on arriving at Port Credit were made welcome by the present Zone Commander and members of Post 88 Canadian Legion.

After a short stay in the club rooms of Port Credit Legion renewing acquaintances with the comrades, the First Vice President of Branch 88 invited the delegates to the main hall where he brought the meeting to order, due to the absence of the President. After the meeting was opened in usual manner the gavel was handed over the Zone Commander E. C. Draw who welcomed the delegates to the meeting. He voiced his sorrow at taking members away from their wives and children on Mother's Day and asked the delegates to bring back with them his apologies for calling the meeting on that date.

Post 88 Port Credit turned out almost 100 per cent and sat around the hall and the delegates given the centre chairs. Each group in charge of the delegates introduced himself, stating the number of delegates from his district. Delegates were from Georgetown, Acton, Brampton, Milton, Streetsville.

Agenda: To decide times and places, etc. of Zone Church Parades, the presentations of Resolutions and other business for the welfare of the Legion. After some discussion it was finally decided to accept the invitation of the Brampton delegates to attend the Decoration Day Services and Church Parade combined to be held early in September in Brampton.

Several Resolutions were brought before the meeting and Georgetown Branch brought up two of these resolutions which were adopted unanimously. These resolutions deal with Legion members and the full text of these will be brought up before the general meeting of the local branch on May 25th.

Several important matters were brought before the meeting and one of these dealt with the rehabilitation of our men now in uniform. Georgetown Branch was complimented by the Zone Commander for the step taken in having their "Questionnaire" printed and mailed to the members of the armed forces. Col. Cousens, as past Zone Commander occupied a seat with the Past Officers and when called upon explained the purpose of the steps taken by the Georgetown Branch to see that the proper care would be given to our boys on their return to private life. A hearty round of applause greeted Col. Cousens after the explanation of what

his committee was doing in Georgetown.

Honorary President E. L. Fleck although only a guest at the meeting was called upon by Zone Commander Draw to say a few words. Mr. Fleck explained the attitude to be taken by the industrialists in helping to re-establish the men in uniform and explained to all present that at all times he took a deep interest in the affairs of the Canadian Legion and that he was willing to carry on and continue to work in the interest of the Legion. He strongly urged the meeting to see that a committee be formed to look after the welfare of the return men in civil life.

Comrade President Harold Stalford of Branch 120 voiced his disapproval in no uncertain terms at what is being done for our present men returning, regarding employment. His statement carried so much weight and his determination so explicit that he was asked by the Zone Commander to retire and draft up a resolution to that effect and when brought before the meeting and read was unanimously approved by the delegates.

Before the meeting was brought to a close Comrade W. Anderson of the Milton Branch spoke on behalf of the delegates complimented Zone Commander Draw on his appointment and stated that all the members of Zone wanted him to know that all will support him 100 per cent on all Legion affairs. Replying Com. Draw thanked the delegates for the honour and trust given him and stated that with the help of all comrades he would try to be worthy of that trust.

President Jack Holmes of the Port Credit Branch attended part of the meeting as he explained he had to work until 4 p.m. He took over the chair and after the usual procedure declared the meeting closed with all singing the National Anthem.

A delightful lunch was served by the members of Port Credit and after an hour spent in the club rooms the local delegates returned to Georgetown, well satisfied that the Zone meeting was a grand success.
