## CROWN ATTORNEY DICK'S SON IS WOUNDED

Crown Attorney W. I. Dick and Mrs. Dick, Milton, have learned that their son, Capt. Kenneth R. Dick, 35, Second Tank Corps, was wounded on August 12 in France. On the second day following his return from a rest camp, Capt. Dick lost his tank. Later the army car in which he was riding overturned and one of the crew required first aid. Capt. Dick removed his helmet for bandages he carried there, when he was struck by shrapnel he wrote his parents.

He was a member of the Lorne Scots Regiment before enlisting with the active service in May, 1941. After training at Brockville, Dobert, Saskatchewan and Camp Borden, he went overseas in June last year. A graduate of Osgoode Hall, Capt. Dick practised law with his father before enlisting. He attended the Milton public and high schools and the University of Toronto.

A sister, Major (Principal Matron) Edith Dick is serving at No. 10 Canadian hospital in France. Two brothers, Lieut. Sydney Dick, Quebec City, and Leading Writer James Dick, St. Hyacinthe, are serving with the Canadian army. His wife, the former Helen Winfield, and son, Kenneth, live in Hamilton.
