Pte. "Chuck" Laws Writes News of the Hasty P's

Four Georgetown Men Serving in Italy with This Famous Regiment — Toronto Newspaper Praises for Smashing Gothic Line.

From Italy comes a letter to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Fred Laws in Georgetown, in which Pte. "Chuck" Laws mentions that the Divisional Commander "congratulated us for good work in the last show." This refers to the hard fighting at San Maria Ridge and Portunato, in which the Hastings & Prince Edward Regiment took a leading part in the victory. A recent item in a Toronto newspaper gives a detailed account of the battles for which the Hasty P's, as they are known, will go down in history's hall of fame.

Pte. Laws typed his letter on a typewriter which the fleeing Germans had abandoned in a house captured by his patrol. He mentions an impressive memorial service held for those who had sacrificed their lives and said that the padre was doing a wonderful work among the boys. At time of writing Pte. Laws had had supper with Pte. Walker Cleave, who is attached to the Regiment as a cook. Pte. Aubrey Kerr, of Norval, who has twice been reported wounded, is also a member of the Hasty P's, as is Cpl. Jack Watson, former manager of the local Dominion Store. "Chuck" has also seen Ptes. Reg. Blair and Jim Marshall recently and reports them both well.
