Mrs. Fred McNally was hostess to
the Georgetown Women's Institute on
Wednesday, December 6th. Mrs. W.
G. McDowell and Mrs. Harry Bailey
occupying the chairs.

The meeting opened in the usual
manner and the minutes of the
previous meeting were read and adopted.
Several items of correspondence were
read and dealt with, among them a
letter from the Navy League asking
for funds and \$5.00 was voted to this
cause.

Before the meeting was handed over
to the programme committee, a mi-
nute of silence was observed in mem-
ory of Mrs. Donald Campbell, who
was a valued member, as well as the
oldest, of the Institute, after which all
joined in repeating the Lord's Prayer.

The programme committee for the
day was Mrs. A. Wilson and Mrs. H.
Cleave. Mrs. E. R. Robinson gave a
report of the convention held at
Guelph last month. Mrs. A. Vannat-
ter and Mrs. H. Wigglesworth sang
two very pleasing duets, accompanied
by Mrs. R. H. Wright. In the absence
of Mrs. Wilson, Mrs. Harold Cleave
read a short essay on Christmas.

After a vote of thanks to the hos-
tess, the programme committee, also
those taking part in the programme,
the meeting closed by singing God
Save the King, and a cup of tea was
served.

PTE. NORMAN McDONALD PRISONER-OF-WAR

Pte. Norman H. McDonald was re-
port missing in action on October 17,
and is now reported a prisoner-of-
war in a German Camp. Radio lis-
teners in England and Scotland heard
him broadcast a message from Germa-
ny to his mother and have written
Mrs. A. McDonald giving her the mes-
sage they heard. He was serving in
Holland when captured.

Following is the letter Mrs. McDon-
ald received from Gladys A. Warman,
Grimbeby, Lincolnshire, England.
"Perhaps you will think this letter im-
pertinent, coming from an unknown
English girl. Each night I listen to
the German radio program which gives
messages from prisoners-of-war. To-
night's messages were handed in by
the men only two days ago and one
from your son, Norman McDonald,
was broadcast, which said he was safe
and well, and please don't worry." The
other letter was written by Jessie
Craig, Golliton, Ayrshire, Scotland.
Norman's brother, Pte. Clifford, was
arrested on September 15th in a
district paper. We are glad to say he
is safe and well in England.
