A LETTER FROM HOLLAND

Mrs. Albert Stapleton has received a most interesting and reassuring letter from a Dutch family named Ruypers, who have been very kind to her husband, Pte. Albert Stapleton, now serving in Holland with the infantry We reprint below, extracts from the letter because it expresses so well how the Dutch people feel about the Allied armies now fighting in their country.

Somewhere, Holland Feb. 3rd, 1946.

Dear Madam: I cannot miss to write you some words as your Albert is just starting to write, and now I use the opportuni-

ty to write a letter to you. In the first place, Madam, we and
