**ARCHIE McKITTRICK
FATAALLY INJURED**

Archie McKittrick, aged 76, father of Mrs. I. McPherson and Mrs. Earl McPherson, Georgetown, was fatally injured when struck down by a west-bound car on Highway No. 9, opposite the 15th concession, East Garafraxa, on Monday night, March 5th. The accident happened about 8:30 o'clock. He was walking west, on the north side of the road. The night was misty with light rain and poor visibility, and the accident is doubtless attributable in a degree to these facts and the fact that Mr. McKittrick was somewhat deaf. Suffering a fractured skull and severe internal injuries, he was dead when admitted to hospital.

The eldest son of the late Mr. and Mrs. James McKittrick, early residents of East Garafraxa, Archie McKittrick was born and spent all of his life in the Waldemar district. At the time of his death, he lived with his son Earl, on the homestead. He was twice married, his first wife, Martha Burke having died some years ago. Mr. McKittrick is survived by his second wife, the former Florence Sargent and the following sons and daughters: Kenneth, East Garafraxa; Mrs. I. McPherson and Mrs. Earl McPherson, Georgetown; Mrs. J. Menary, Laurel; also two brothers and three sisters.

Mr. McKittrick had been visiting Mr. and Mrs. B. McPherson, and was walking home when he met his death. The funeral was held from the home of his son Kenneth, on Friday, March 9th. Interment was in Frise's Corner's Cemetery, 12th Line, East Garafraxa.
