PTE. G. SIMPSON OVERSEAS FOUR YEARS AND IN D-DAY INVA-SION RETURNS HOME

After having served overseas nearly four years with the 12th Field Unit of the RCA, Pte. Geo. Simpson, only son of the late Mr. and Mrs. George Simpson of Guelph, whose wife and son reside in the Valleyview Apartments here, arrived home on a 30-day rotation leave.

Pte. Simpson enlisted in June, 1940, from Guelph, and trained in his home city and Sussex, N.B., embarking for overseas in July, 1941. He landed with the D-Day troops in France on June 6th of last year, and following several weeks' duty on the continent was returned to the British Isles. He spoke highly of the various auxiliary services, giving special mention to the Knights of Columbus and the Salvation Army.

A native of Guelph, Pte. Simpson went to school there. Following his leave here he will report to MD 1 at London, Ontario.

AT THE TOWNSHIP HALL, IN THE TOWNSHIP OF TRAFALGAR, on TUESDAY, the 8th of MAY, 1945, to hear complaints as to the List of Voters for all Polling subdivisions in the said Township. Last day for filing appeals 4th May, 1945.

If necessary night sittings will be held at each of the above named places—between the hours of seven-thirty and nine-thirty o'clock p.m.

And FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that any voter who desires to complain that his or her name or the name of any person entitled to be entered on the said list has been omitted from the same, or that the names of any persons who are not entitled to be voters have been entered thereon, may on or before the dates respectively above set out, apply, complain or appeal to have his or the name of any other person entered on, or removed from the list.

And FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that such appeals must be by notice in writing in the prescribed form, signed by the complainant in DUPLICATE and given to the Clerk of the Revising Officer or left for him at his address as stated above.

And FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that the Voters' Lists to be revised are those of the several municipalities in the said County of Halton, as revised by the County Judge or certified by the Clerk of the Peace in the year 1944. An appeal should be made for anyone entitled to vote whose name does not appear in Part I or Part III of the said Voters' Lists.
