Local Council of Women

On Friday, April 20th, the regular meeting of the Local Council of Women was held in the Municipal building at 8 p. m.

The president, Mrs. R. Paul opened the meeting with silent prayer, and asked us to remember the members of the San Francisco Conference and also the late Franklin Roosevelt.

After the business was disposed of Mrs. Paul welcomed Miss Sybil Bennett who needed no introduction to an audience in Georgetown. She took for subject, "The Women of the Dominion of Canada".

She gave a very fine address and impressed on us how fortunate we Canadian women are. We have, and enjoy many things that other countries do not. The women in early days came in here and hewed out homes for themselves and that spirit is still with them, as their efficiency has proven in this war. They have kept their homes running, and worked side by side with men, and some have done outstandingly finer work than men, such as in tool making. Miss Bennett further said our first attitude as a council, should be to unite, to take a deeper interest in public affairs, and uphold British Law.

She said women are in the majority and could get anything they want after if they would use the franchise, and urged every woman to vote for some one. Women haven't a vote in some countries, so we should make use of our vote here.
