No person may move to and rent or occupy family quarters in any of these congested areas without a permit from the Administrator of Emergency Shelter

Before making arrangements to vacate your present home, be sure that you have other accommodation and a permit to occupy it. Applications for permits should be addressed to the Administrator of Emergency Shelter in the area to which you plan to move.

Every person who rents or occupies family quarters in any of these districts contrary to the order, commits an offence and, in addition to other penalties, will be required to vacate the shelter and the district at his own expense.

### GLEN NATIVE, MRS. HOWARD DELLER DIED IN U.S.A.

A native of Glen Williams, Mrs. Sophie Verena Deller, wife of Rev. Howard F. Deller, D.D., died on Monday, July 9th, at the home of her son in Groton, N.Y. The late Mrs. Deller lived on the farm on the 9th Lane with her parents, William and Katherine Reid McGregor until her marriage in 1913. She attended Glen Williams Public School and Georgetown High School.

In poor health for several months, she had been a patient for observation and treatment in Strong Memorial Hospital, Rochester, and left hospital only a few days before her death. Dr. and Mrs. Deller moved to Pulaski, N. Y. in 1942, from Oxford, N.Y., where he had been pastor of the Congregational Church for ten years. She was a devoted wife and mother and popular among the church people with whom she worked.

Surviving are her husband, three sons, McGregor Deller, of Groton, N. Y., Pte. Lawrence Deller in the Pacific area and Pte. Wallace Deller in England; two sisters, Mrs. T. Rogerson (Lena) of Streetsville, and Mrs. C. Edgar Ruddell (Sadie) of Toronto, and one brother, Norman McGregor, of Brantford.

The funeral was held from the Seymour Funeral Home on Thursday, July 12th, with Rev. G. Edgar Wolfe in charge of the service. The body was then taken to Waterville for cremation.
