FERGUS CHURCH SECULARIZED

On Tuesday evening, July 24th, a unique ceremony took place at Fergus, and was participated in by Archdeacon Thompson, St. James' Church, which had been consecrated years ago, but had become unsuitable for worship, owing to condition and location, was "secularized" by Right Reverend L. W. B. Broughall, Bishop of Niagara. After Evensong had been concluded,

with a sermon by the Bishop suitable to the occasion, the Rector, Rev. C. J. Loat, with his Churchwardens, standing at the altar rail, facing the Bishop, read a petition requesting that the dedication and consecration be removed from St. James' Church, and giving the reasons for the request. The Bishop then made the act requested, and the sacred building was secularized.
