BUILT-IN CUPBOARDS MUST IN POST-WAR KITCHENS

If women in the plant were stopped and asked what they needed most for their kitchens at home, the odds are that every sixth would answer "built-in cupboards".

In a nation-wide poll in which thousands of Canadian women were interviewed, an Eastern Canadian manufacturing concern recently learned that one-tenth of the women have no cupboards for their dishes. One in four keeps her pots and pans on shelves or nails—a perfectly good reason why they want cupboards. And nearly one-third of the women who do have cupboards report them to be too small.

As far as kitchens were concerned generally, the women interviewed suggested that kitchens were arranged like industrial plant assembly lines, so that one operation followed logically and with least effort from another, they would have more energy left for other interests. Unfortunately, the average kitchen arrangement of today is far from perfect with stove, ice-box, sink, placed haphazardly about the room.

It was also learned that kitchen sinks are too low for one-fifth of the women. Their backs ache from crouching over them. Only one person in more than 20 says her kitchen sink is too high.

Demand for bigger kitchens arises partly from the fact that many Canadians have all their meals there, the year round, except when company calls. During cold weather particularly most families eat close to the warmth of the stove and source of supply.
