His salary will be \$2400, plus a \$700 car allowance for the year,

Increases in salary were voted for two county officials and treasurer, Miss Margaret Maxted will now receive \$1700 and Clerk Wm. Deans, \$1350. The new salaries are retroactive to Nov. 1st, 1945.
