**EX-MAYOR BECK WINS IN CLOSE BRAMPTON CIVIC ELECTION**  
 Ex-Mayor J. S. Beck, running against 1945 Mayor Harper Bull, was winner in the January 7th Mayoralty contest in the Peel County town, polling 840 votes to his opponent's 763. Mr. Beck, in his campaign criticized the 1945 Council for not reducing the tax rate and for hiring a town planner to make a survey of the town, as well as action taken in granting \$5000 towards the erection of a new Legion Hall.

The Council poll was headed by Alderman E. A. "Kid" Ingram, proprietor of the Green Lantern, who used to be in Georgetown frequently in his capacity as Dominion Store district manager. Harold Lawrence and Isaac Kellam were returned by acclamation as Reeve and Deputy Reeve.
