CROWN ATTORNEY O. K.S. LEGION BINGOS

As a result of representations made to Crown Attorney W. I. Dick of Milton, by the local Branch 120, Canadian Legion, permission has been secured to operate Saturday night bingo games in the Legion Rooms.
