WARDEN HILLMER OPENS GLEN BRIDGE

C. V. Hillmer, Reeve of Oakville and Halton County Warden, cut the ribbon at the official opening of the new Glen bridge last Saturday afternoon. A good crowd was on hand to witness the event, including members of Esquewing and Halton Councils, and J. V. Ludgate, District Municipal Engineer.
 Ven. W. G. O. Thompson dedicated the bridge and read a short prayer. Mrs. Mary Pettit, Reeve of Nelson, had the honour of driving the first car across the new structure.
 The bridge, of steel and reinforced concrete structure with steel sides, was constructed by the Reg. A. Blyth Company of Toronto, at an estimated cost of \$21,000, and replaces one washed out by heavy spring floods.
