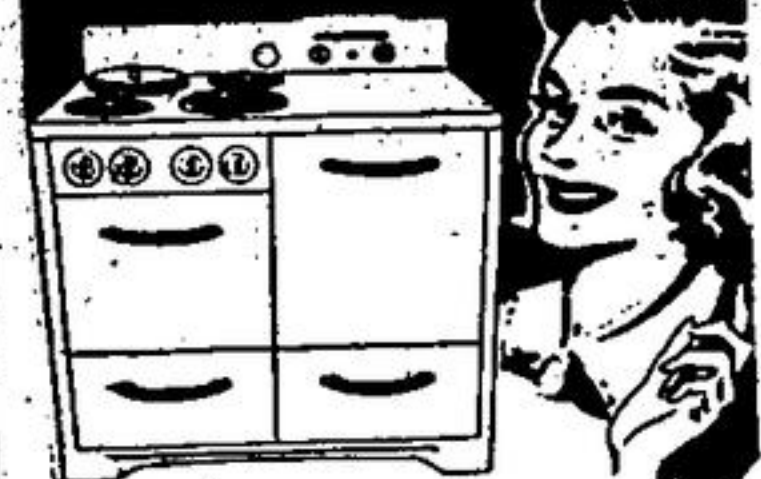

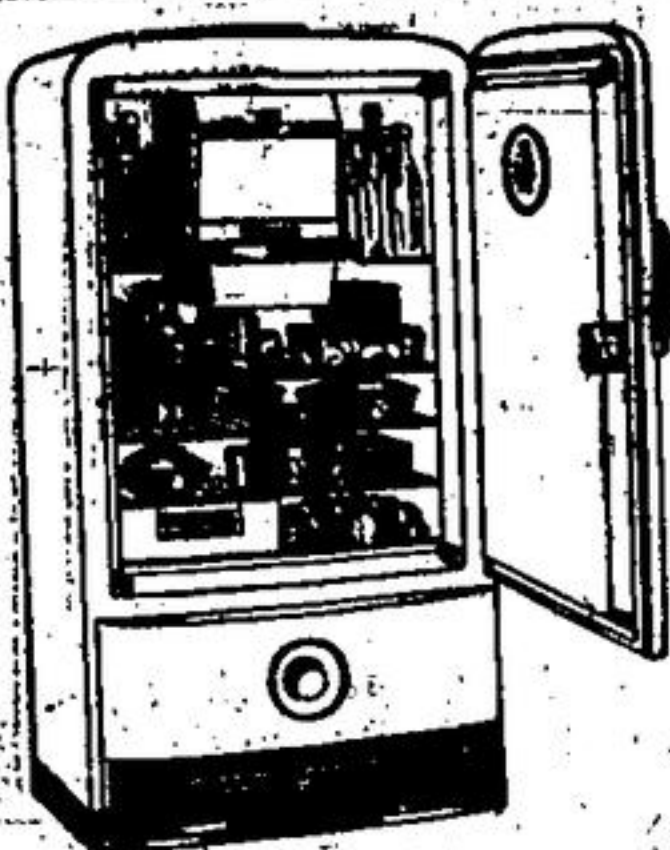

**Four-All Tie in Second Game with Fergus**

Papermakers Miss Title-Clinching Chance in Final Seconds—Play in Galt This Friday Night.

Over 1800 fans, including a large number of Georgetown rooters, viewed a hockey match in Fergus on Friday night which at times was little more than "shinny," due to extremely poor ice. The game is probably the last which will be played on natural ice in the district this winter and fans will see the rest of their hockey at the artificial ice rink in Galt.

Fergus Thistles entered the game very much the underdogs, having been well-beaten here 4-2 a week Friday in the first of a best two-of-three series. However, Lady Luck smiled on them through most of the game, starting with a fluke goal at the first of the game which bounced past Evans from a team-mate's skate. Fergus led from that point until well into the third period when Bertwistle, Beaumont and Shropshire teamed for a beautiful goal at the 14 minute mark to tie things up.

Ferri got his second goal of the game half-way through the 10-minute overtime period and Georgetown had the edge from then on, with Fergus trying desperately to break through the defence. With seconds remaining, Hilson popped in the all-important counter which put the Thistles back in the running.

Our three stars for the game go to Hilson, Ferri and Ward; Hilson for his three goals and steady playing throughout, Ferri for his usual pluck in hurdling the Thistles stone wall and tallying two important goals, and "Bugsy" Ward, who soled in the first period to start the Papermakers on their way.

The third play-off game (and the last if Georgetown wins) will be played in Galt this Friday night, and we expect that all roads will lead there as Georgetown cheers its team on to the group championship.
