LOCAL LADS TRINCE BEATEN IN MIDGET CHAMPIONSHIP PLAY-OFFS

An anxious group of boys left the home town last Friday determined to present the best show they could possibly make, and they sure did. The scene was at Toronto's Maple Leaf Gardens, where a championship Ontario midget play-off had been arranged by Gordon Alcott, a Georgetown old-boy who is now sports director for the International Nickel Company in the Sudbury district. Teams from Copper Cliff, Garson, Sudbury, Falconbridge, Weston and Georgetown were competing, and honours for the day went to Copper Cliff and Sudbury. On Saturday afternoon Copper Cliff played off with St. Michael's College Midgets and came out on the short end of a 6-2 score.

Georgetown's team were somewhat bewildered in their first appearance on artificial ice, coupled with the fact that the group was an all-star aggregation picked from all the teams in Georgetown and had never practiced as a team. In spite of this, they played some good hockey and we are looking forward to a winning team next year.

Georgetown was first jolted by Copper Cliff to a 10-0 tune. Despite the amount of rubber passing goalie Ross Dillon he turned in a fine job as he was being peppered by the speedy lads of the North.

Upon encountering another group of northerners hailing from Garson the play seemed to be wide open and after the smoke of battle had died away Garson had flashed the light an even half dozen times against the single tally potted by Beaumont.

We were only present at the final game — the best, we were told — in which the Georgetown boys in blue, were once more on the low half of a 6-2 count. This game's score would have undoubtedly been much higher if it had not been for the stellar goal-tending of Dillon. J. Haines and Norton netted the Georgetown counters. In all these games—2 twenty minute games were played, straight time, all for the final five minutes of the second frame.
