"... AND NOW FOR A POUND OF EGGS MADAM?"



● Quoting eggs by the pound would be confusing, wouldn't it? You buy eggs by the dozen, milk by the quart, meat by the pound. By what measure do you buy electricity?

You buy electricity by the kilowatt-hour, and you should know what a kilowatt-hour can do for you.

An electric lamp or appliance is usually marked "60 watts", "500 watts", "1000 watts", as the case may be. The mark simply indicates the number of watts of electricity that the lamp or appliance will use. A kilowatt is simply 1000 watts. A kilowatt-hour is 1000 watts used for one hour—or 100 watts for ten hours. So that one kilowatt-hour will operate your 1000 watt electric iron for one hour. And at what a small cost!
